Mission

Overview

The Floating Classrooms Winter Volunteer will serve as an educator for the Community Sailing Center (CSC)'s Floating Classrooms working independently, as well as alongside the Education and Outreach Coordinator. This is a mission-driven and standards-based educational program offered in partnership with local schools. The volunteer will be an ambassador of the CSC. Therefore, they must be friendly, courteous, and passionate about the organization's mission. Lessons include but are not limited to bathymetry, energy transfer, and water quality.

Reports to: Education & Outreach Coordinator

The intern works directly with both Education and Outreach Manager and Coordinator to implement Floating Classrooms lessons.

Qualifications: The ideal candidate possesses a desire to develop their personal teaching skills. Please be willing to learn various skills to be successful in a diverse program and dynamic educational environment. Additionally interns must be enthusiastic about working with grades 4-5.

- Demonstrated interest in environmental education, natural history, and ecology of the Lake Champlain Basin and Vermont.
- The intern is dynamic able to work both independently and as part of a team.
- Comfortable speaking to groups.
- Experience designing lesson plans, curriculum, or an outdoor experiential trip (*not required*).
- Sailing experience (*not required*).
- Reliable transportation (*not required*).

Responsibilities

- Teach environmental, place-based lessons suitable for students in grades 4-5.
- Gather materials and clean up before and after each program.
- The intern must have empathy for the students and be able to adapt to their individual needs.
- Potential opportunity for curriculum development and alignment of CSC curriculum to Reach: US Sailing's STEM Education Series, The Common Core, and the Next Generation Science Standards.
