

With Lake Champlain literally at our doorstep, we're able to orchestrate countless opportunities to spark "aha!" moments that are essential for young people to truly understand themselves and the world around them. **1,845 youth and adults** participated in our signature programs this summer, for a total of 8,987 programming hours. That is **8,987 hours** spent rigging boats, working with a team, learning about how pollution affects ecosystems, building confidence, and relishing experiences that highlight personal – and sometimes surprising – strengths, passions, and abilities inside each student.

Our signature programs provide a unique approach to immersive education that uses the waters and shores of Lake Champlain and the sport of sailing to create strong ties between learning and the lake.

ADAPTIVE WATERSPORTS PROGRAM

Few things in life compare to sailing for its therapeutic benefits, uplifting and rejuvenating the spirit. It builds confidence and self esteem, while challenging the whole person.

This summer the Adaptive Watersports Program, in partnership with Vermont Adaptive Ski & Sports and Special Olympics Vermont, created opportunities for over **468 people with diverse abilities** to use the Sailing Center as a gateway to the water...leaving their dependence on the dock.

CUSTOM PROGRAMS

This summer we offered customized programs for over **1,046 participants**, including a special day for seniors through a partnership with AARP Vermont. We welcomed over **274 members** to the waterfront for kayaking, paddleboarding clinics, keelboat rides, and much more.

PADDLEBOARDING

Endless sun and warm temperatures made it almost impossible to resist the lure of cool, fresh Lake Champlain water splashing invitingly on hot sandy beaches. We added **five new SUPs for youth**, allowing kids as young as 6 years old to experience the lake from another vantage point. AARP members also took our fleet of SUP out for an afternoon and proved that it's a **sport for all ages!** Paddle boards played a more central role in several of our signature programs including our Women In Wind Program in partnership with the **Greater Burlington Women's Forum**, and our LeaderSHIP program in partnership with the **CHILL Foundation**.

On the horizon is a new community asset that gives everyone the opportunity to be closer to something they love.

The 22,180-square-foot lakeside hub includes:

- · Classroom space for year-round learning, including hands-on science for 4th and 5th graders in the Burlington School District.
- New boats and docks to connect over 6,000 residents and visitors with the lake.
- · Accessible features to welcome everyone to the waterfront regardless of physical ability.
- Locker rooms for community use including the UVM and Northern VT High School Sailing Teams.
- Staff offices where award-winning programming will expand to serve even more of our community.
