First Sails introduced 99 people of all ages to the wonders of sailing on their very first boat ride, and for some, paved the way for their very first experience on the broad lake.

Youth Camps showed more children than ever what independence, resilience, and fun can look like on Lake Champlain. Over a total of **16,119.5 hours** of play, **479 kids** from ages six to sixteen connected with the water and new friends as they took charge of their sense of adventure!

Adult Courses taught 254 people that acquiring a new skill can happen at any age. For many Lake Champlain became a place of connection and a playground for recreation amidst their busy lives.

Students participating in the Floating Classroom Program look forward to Ms. Hikey's visits and often report that her lessons were their favorite part of the day!"

LeaderShip helped **950** youth (177 more than 2018) expand skills to thrive in school, at home, and as part of a community.

Floating Classrooms made Lake Champlain a laboratory for 2,035 students. These 15 schools and partners participated in **4,764.75** hours of learning (a 33.6% increase in participants and 40.8% increase in hours from 2018).

Performance Sailing provided 64 sailors from our Northern Vermont High School Sailing Team (NVHSST), **Bic Race, and Summer Race programs** the opportunity to work together, seek achievement, and gain independence through responsibility. These programs sailed over the course of **3,000 hours** and competed in 14 regattas.

The Adaptive Watersports Program, in partnership with Vermont

Adaptive Ski & Sports, created opportunities for 177 people with diverse abilities.

The CSC McConnell Scholarship awarded **2,200 individuals** a total of **\$72,537** in scholarships.

Women in Wind took 174 women & girls on the water to build their confidence and resilience through adventure!

The new Free Fall Sailing Program aimed to decrease financial barriers to anyone who knew how to sail in our community. In September and October, we served 174 groups on dinghies, keelboats, and paddle craft - a 100% increase from 2018.

In 2019, the CSC strived to make the waterfront a place for our community to gather. Through our events, volunteer program, and community partnerships, our goal was to give people ownership

of Lake Champlain.

An Evening with Laura Dekker, the youngest person ever to circumnavigate the globe single handedly, was the highlight of an inspiring speaker series on creating your own on-water adventure. Dekker shared her experience to over 300 individuals, one-third of which were children.

103 volunteers gave 768.5 hours of their time to the CSC.

We partnered with **103 community partners** to provide programming and transformative on-water experiences for individuals throughout the area regardless of background. Partners include:
